
The evolution of the NHS – CILT(UK) Learning & Development Academy

3 ADVANCING CAPABILITY


Highlights global supply chain interconnectivity, equipping learners to monitor performance and manage people, quality, and costs to achieve strategic goals.





Did You Know?

The CILT(UK) team visited 10 hospitals across the country in December 23, spending time with NHS leadership teams and procurement and supply chain practitioners and professionals. Following this a pilot programme was launched which became the blueprint of the programme today.

CILT(UK) has collaborated with the CCF team for approximately 18 months, developing NHS-specific content and testing it through a 13-week pilot programme involving 197 learners across 77 NHS organisations and 33 ICS footprints.


